besides this Danish duo, PSG Norwegian centre back Sander Sagosen had played for a Danish club - Aalborg - before he joined Paris in 2017

- although both clubs never won the CL, both have former winners in their squad: Skjern count on Anders Eggert and Thomas Mogensen (both with Flensburg in 2014), while Nikola Karabatic (2003 with Montpellier, 2007 with Kiel and 2015 with Barcelona) and Viran Morros (2008, 2009 with Ciudad Real, 2015 with Barcelona) even have three trophies each on their account, while PSG goalkeeper Thierry Omeyer owns four trophies (2003 with Montpellier, 2007, 2010 and 2012 with Kiel) and Luc Abalo won the competition twice (2008, 2009 with Ciudad Real)
- PSG do not only have the second best defence of all 16 Group A/B teams (105 goals conceded) but by far the best goal difference (+30), while Skjern have a negative goal difference (122:125)
- the venue in Herning is definitely a better omen for the French national team players than for the Danish: Omeyer, Abalo and the Karabatic brothers were on court in the soldout Jyske Bank Boxen on 26 January 2014, when France beat Denmark in the EHF EURO 2014 final 41:32; their PSG teammate Mikkel Hansen was clearly beaten such as were the current Skjern players Mogensen, Eggert and Kasper Söndergaard
- Söndergaard, Henrik Toft Hansen and Mikkel Hansen struck back with Denmark in the 2016 Olympic final, beating Omeyer, Abalo, the Karabatic brothers and France in Rio 28:26
- on 24 August 2008, Skjern Icelandic goalkeeper Björgvin Pal Gustavsson duelled with today's PSG stars Nikola Karabatic and Luc Abalo in the Olympic final in Beijing - France took their first Olympic gold medal winning 28:23
- Jyske Bank Boxen is one of two venues all over Europe, which hosted finals of Men's and Women's EURO events (2014 and 2010) and a Women's World Championship (2015), the second one is Kombank Arena Belgrade (EURO events 2012 and World Championship 2013). On 27 January 2019, the arena will host the Men's WCh final
- Danish PSG left back Mikkel Hansen has a special relationship to the arena, as he received his first of two IHF World Player of the year awards there in 2011
- on 23 October 2016, PSG already played a CL match at Herning, when they beat Bjerringbro-Silkeborg 36:30, attended by 10,204 fans
- since the return on the international stage in the 2013/14 season, PSG have won all four matches against Danish teams (twice against PSG, twice against Aalborg)
- on the other hand, Skjern's dream of making it to Cologne ended in France, losing the quarter-final at eventual finalist HBC Nantes 27:33
- the last time, Skjern were part of a MOTW, they lost at Veszprem 29:34 in the second leg of the 2017/18 Last 16, but jumped for joy, as they proceeded to the quarter-final thanks to a 32:25 victory on home ground
