NEW MEDIA SERVICE: TEAM LINE-UPS AND MATCH REPORTS

With the start of the 2012/13 season, comes an improvement to the media services offered by the EHF. From the opening matches of the season, the complete team line-up has been available online at eurohandball.com and available to download as a PDF document. The change has been made possible thanks to the introduction of a new online solution, which sees the EHF match delegate complete the final team line-up immediately after the technical meeting. The new development means that team line-ups are available for commentators and reporters hours before each match throws-off.

A further change means that a short time after each match, a completed match report will also be available online with details such as goal scorers and number of spectators. Tested during the opening rounds of the EHF Cup as well as the VELUX EHF Champions League and Women's EHF Champions League qualification rounds, the new system has so far functioned without any major problems.

Team line-ups and match reports can be viewed by clicking on a particular match on the eurohandball.com. The new online system is also under further development with the ultimate aim being to provide live scores and statistics from EHF competitions and available on the EHF website.

The written media and photographer's accreditation procedure in the Group Phase is entirely in the responsibility of the participating clubs. TV and Radio accreditations are subjects to approval by EHF Marketing GmbH – please contact Ákos Moczan.

LIVE MATCHES

Handball fans across Europe will be able to follow numerous matches of the Men's EHF Cup live. Many matches will be broadcast live on ehfTV.com and the videos of those matches will be also on demand. The comprehensive offer of each round can be found on ehfTV.com.

MEDIA AND ADVERTISING RIGHTS

The changes to the playing format of the EHF Cup form part of a wider strategy to develop the marketing potential of the competition, by raising the profile of the EHF Cup and increasing media/TV interest in top-class men's club handball. It is with this in mind that media/TV rights will be marketed centrally, just as they are in the VELUX EHF Champions League, by EHF Marketing GmbH, the marketing arm of the EHF, to maximise the income from the sale of rights.

Complete advertising rights will remain with the participating clubs in the qualification rounds, with selected rights passing to EHF Marketing GmbH from the Group Phase to be marketed and sold centrally to major partners and sponsors. To improve the presentation of matches for both the TV audience and fans in the arenas, matches from the Group Phase onwards will be played on floors marked with only handball lines. The further development of the competition in the coming and subsequent seasons has seen the EHF and EHF Marketing GmbH create a new logo for the competition as well as a unified look and branding, a strategy that has seen the VELUX EHF Champions League rapidly develop into a successful brand and competition on the international sports market.

NEW LOGO: NEW LOOK FOR A NEW COMPETITION



The newly launched competition has entered its premier season with a new logo which followed the new logos of both premier European club competitions. The VELUX EHF Champions League and Women's EHF Champions League logos were the first in a series of developments, which now see a refresh and modernisation of the European Handball Federation's corporate identity.

PREVIEW OF THE EHF CUP GROUP PHASE

16 teams from 12 countries, six rounds with 48 matches in total – those are the ingredients of the first ever Group Phase in the new EHF Cup. The first round will be played all over Europe this weekend (9/10 February), the remaining five rounds will be played until 24 March to confirm those six to eight teams, which qualify for the quarterfinals – the last stage before the first ever EHF Cup Finals with semi-finals, 3rd place match and final to be played in Nantes (France) 18/19 May.

If the host, HBC Nantes, is among the four group winners or the three best second ranked teams after the Group Phase, the French team make their way directly to the final tournament without playing a quarter-final. In this case, only the four group winners and the two best second ranked teams face in the quarterfinals. If Nantes is fourth best second ranked team, they also will have to compete in the quarterfinals, which then are played with all group winners and second ranked teams in April. Nantes are part of group D with Besiktas (Turkey), Magdeburg (Germany) and Bacau (Romania).

Germany is the only country, represented by three teams in this Group Phase, including Frisch Auf Göppingen, the last winner of the “old” EHF Cup in the 2011/12 season, Magdeburg and Rhein Neckar Löwen. Denmark (Holstebro and Kolding) and Slovenia (Koper and Maribor) are represented by two teams each, the remaining nine nations can count on one participant each.

From the historical and statistical point of view, SC Magdeburg is the most successful of all 16 teams – including the triumph in the EHF Champions League in 2002 and three trophies in the “old” EHF Cup (1999, 2001, 2007). Four of the 16 participating teams of the EHF Cup Group Phase failed in the qualification tournaments for the VELUX EHF Champions League, but now try their next attempt to be successful in the EHF Cup competition: Prešov (SVK), Koper (SLO), Besiktas (TUR) and Plock (POL).

And three teams had to go all the way in the EHF Cup qualification to be among the 16 teams, having played already three qualification rounds in the EHF Cup: Elverum (NOR), Kolding (DEN) and Maribor (SLO). The biggest surprise in the qualification was the clear elimination of French top team St. Raphael by the Danish youngsters from Holstebro in Round 3.

Now each team have three home and three away matches in the newly installed Group Phase in the upcoming seven weeks. The draw for the quarter-finals will be on 26 March.

The three German teams, but also Kolding, Plock and Nantes were mentioned most of the time by the coaches of the 16 participants as the favourites for reaching the Final Tournament or winning the new trophy.

QUALIFICATION REVIEW: MIRACLE IN ISTANBUL

All sixteen clubs of the Men's EHF Cup Group Phase have been confirmed over the first weekend of December as at several places only the narrowest margins decided about the proceeding teams in the second leg of Round 3.

On Saturday Polish runners-up Orlen Wisła Płock and the winners of the last edition of the old EHF Cup Frisch Auf! Göppingen were among those teams qualified for the top sixteen of the competition, on the other hand the Austrian title holders Alpla HC Hard, Portuguese champions Porto or the Spanish top seed BM Aragon made early exits from the continental club competitions.

On Sunday, two more German teams joined Göppingen as Rhein Neckar Löwen made a compulsory dance in Argous and SC Magdeburg survived the hell in the Kale hall in Skopje against hosts from Vardar Skopje. Norwegian champions Haslum HK squandered eleven goal lead after the first leg as they lost by twelve in Istanbul against Beşiktaş JK.

Romania's Știința Municipal Dedeman Bacău qualified already a week earlier, since both matches with Israeli champions Maccabi Srugo Rishon Lezion had to be played in Romania due to the security concerns.

LAST QUALIFICATION ROUND OVERVIEW

RK Vojvodina (SRB) vs. Naturhouse La Rioja (ESP) 26:22 (10:9), first leg: 19:28

Spanish team which was seeded directly for the third round suffered the first defeat in the second match, but thanks to a nine goal cushion from the home duel they easily qualified for the Group Phase.

BM Aragon (ESP) vs. Eskilstuna Guif (SWE) 31:27 (16:13), first leg: 26:30

With aggregate score tied at Aragon lost only because of the away goals rule as Swedish team Eskilstuna Guif scored just one more goal in Zaragoza (27:31) as Aragon did in Sweden last week (26:30).

FC Porto Vitalis (POR) vs. RK Cimos Koper (SLO) 27:22 (12:10), first leg: 23:29

Another thrilling match was played in Porto's Dragon's Den (Dragao Caixa) where the hosts beat RK Cimos Koper 27:22, but could not erase the six goal deficit from the first leg played on the court of the Slovenian surprise package of the VELUX EHF Champions League last season's. In a dramatic finish Porto played with an extra attacker with six players against four visitors on the court, but the last second shot of Wilson Davyes from nine meters was blocked by Matjaž Brumen. "We could feel the absence of Nikola Manojlović very much on both ends of the court. Porto have a good team with many Portuguese internationals and they proved their quality tonight. At the end our more experienced players took over the responsibility and our goalkeeper Gorazd Škof had a great night," Koper's coach Fredi Radojkovič said at the press conference.

SL Benfica (POR) vs. HBC Nantes (GER) 28:22 (11:11), first leg: 21:29

The French top seeded team from Nantes lost in Lisbon against Benfica 22:28, but never got in real troubles during the match as the "violets" cautiously protected their eight goals lead from the first match and Portuguese hosts reached the dangerous distance too late.

Sungul Snezhinsk (RUS) vs. Orlen Wisła Płock (POL) 24:29 (12:16), first leg: 23:37

After an impressive 37:24 first leg victory against Sungul Snezhinsk Płock confirmed their progress with another win (29:24) despite playing without their goalkeeping stalwart. Croatian Marin Šego was denied to enter Russia by the clerks at the Yekaterinburg airport, but his colleague Marcin Wichary had a stellar performance and with 52 per cent saving efficiency led his team to a comfortable victory. Top scorer of the match was Norwegian right winger Christian Spanne with 11 goals. Polish team, which failed at the Wild Card tournament of the VELUX EHF Champions League in September, had to overcome not only the shock caused by Šego, but the minus 20 temperatures and five time zones shift too. In the second half they increased the lead to nine goals and only then Snezhinsk managed to cut the deficit.

HC Meshkov Brest (BLR) vs. Frisch Auf! Göppingen (GER) 24:29 (11:16), first leg: 17:29

Also Göppingen were dominant in the re-match with Meshkov Brest and after 29:17 victory in Germany the bundesliga team beat the Belarusian hosts 29:24. Manuel Späth and Mitar Markež scored 7 goals each, Croatian Ljubo Vukić netted nine times for Brest.

Alpla HC Hard (AUT) vs. HC Motor Zaporozhye (UKR) 22:33 (9:17), first leg: 26:27

Austrian title holders failed to turn the promising result of the first leg against Ukraine's HC Motor Zaporozhye (26:27) into a progress. They paid costly for too many technical errors in the first half and since 6:6 Motor were able to make a run to 10:6 and later to 17:9. The destruction of the home team continued after the break (20:9) and when trailing by twelve (14:26) six Alpla prospects were sent to the field to gain some international experience.

Tatran Prešov (SVK) vs. RK Borac m:tel Banja Luka (BIH) 30:25 (12:11), first leg: 36:25

Slovakian champions Tatran Prešov also accomplished the Group Phase objective quite easily. Entering the second leg against RK Borac m:tel Banja Luka on the home court with a 11 goal lead Prešov failed to repeat the same dominant performance against the Bosnian side, but they still managed to win 30:25 and landed in the Pot 1 before the draw of four groups.

RK Sloga Doboj (BIH) vs. Elverum Handball Herrer (NOR) 27:37 (15:16), first leg: 24:34

Norway's Elverum copied the ten goal victory from the first leg in Bosnia as well as they broke down the resistance of Sloga Doboj in the second half and won 37:27. Andre Lindboe scored 12 goals for the visitors as he reached the milestone of 50 goals in six matches of the EHF Cup. Despite losing the second leg 22:26 on the RK Vojvodina's ground Spanish team Naturhouse La Rioja sailed past the hosts to the next stage after bringing nine goals cushion to Serbia.

RK Maribor Branik (SLO) vs. RK Siscia (CRO) 35:22 (19:13), first leg: 29:30

Slovenia's Maribor completed the successful run to the Group Phase from the Round 1 as they avoid any complications with Croatia's Siscia at home. Branik quickly deleted one goal deficit from the first leg and built a decisive six goal lead. The former player of Siscia Nikola Spelić was the best scorer of Maribor with seven goals.

AC Diomidis Argous (GRE) vs. Rhein-Neckar Löwen (GER) 27:27 (14:11), first leg: 17:37

Serbian left back Žarko Šešum netted 12 goals in Loutraki in the second leg, but his German team was close to an unexpected defeat against the Greek Challenge Cup winners of the last season. Argous led by three goals at the half-time break, but at the end they had to settle with the draw.

KIF Kolding (DEN) vs. Permskie Medvedi (RUS) 41:24 (17:13), first leg: 27:30

Not even another stellar shooting performance of Yuriy Orlov could prevent Permskie Medvedi from being eliminated by KIF Kolding. Orlov scored astonishing 23 goals against the new Danish giant and half of the Russian side output, but it was not enough to stop the avalanche in the second half as Kolding won the second part 24:11.

Saint-Raphaël Var Handball (FRA) vs. Team Tvis Holstebro (DEN) 35:32 (18:15), first leg: 19:35

French club was able to copy goals scored of Holstebro from the first leg, but the defence of the home team allowed 13 more goals than the Danish side a week ago. Aurelien Abily said this season's farewell to the European club competitions as the top scorer of the match with ten goals.

Beşiktaş JK (TUR) vs. Haslum HK (NOR) 37:25 (18:9), first leg: 20:31

Ramazan Döne scored 14 times as his team accomplished a Herculean task and rallied from eleven goals deficit from Norway and beat Scandinavians by twelve.

HC Vardar PRO Skopje (MKD) vs. SC Magdeburg (GER) 28:26 (14:14), first leg: 27:30

Ten goals by Austrian right wing Robert Weber paved the way to the Group Phase for Magdeburg after a thrilling second leg at the Kale hall in the Macedonian capital. The team from German league managed to pull back to two goals deficit in the last minute despite playing with one player suspended.

Maccabi Srugim Rishon LeZion (ISR) vs. Stiinta Municipal Dedeman Bacau (ROU) 22:22 (12:12), first leg 22:33 (8:15)

Despite playing more open match against Romanian hosts Israeli champions remained too far away from erasing the ten goal deficit from the first leg.

NANTES HOSTING THE PREMIERE EDITION OF EHF CUP FINALS



The venue for the first edition of the Men's EHF Cup Final Tournament has been announced in Belgrade on the fringes of the 10th Women's EHF European Championship, being held in Serbia from 4 to 16 December 2012. The announcement, before the draw for the Group Phase of the competition, saw the event awarded to the French city of Nantes and to HBC Nantes. The French league club will itself compete in the Group Phase of the competition for a place in the Final Tournament. The club has agreed to host the event even if they do not

qualify for the final event.

Nantes and surrounding region in western France, boasts 27,000 handball players and 177 handball clubs and the city of Nantes prides itself on its sporting heritage. Amongst many international handball events, the city hosted the Women's World Championship in 2007. HBC Nantes has also hosted the French League Cup in 2010 and 2011, selling out their 5,000 seat arena on both occasions.

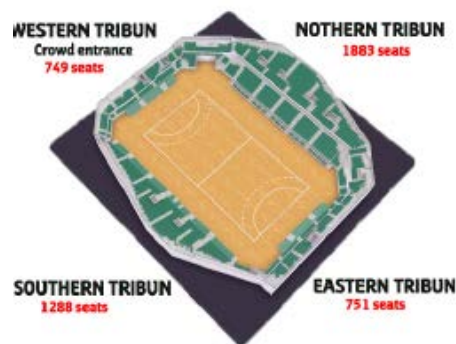
Commenting on the awarding of the event to Nantes, Jean Brihault, EHF President, said: "We considered a number of excellent applications to host the event, but the French city of Nantes presented us with a concept that we felt would really work, especially in the first year. Handball is hugely popular in the region and with the support of the club and the local region we are sure that the premiere edition of the new EHF Cup Final Tournament will be in safe hands."

Qualification Round 3: 29:17, 29:24 against HC Meshkov Brest

Group Phase Preview:

After winning the old format of the EHF Cup twice in its final seasons, Frisch Auf Göppingen is aiming for the final tournament in the first edition of the new format. Göppingen is one of those German clubs with the longest tradition as they dominated European handball in the 1960s. After decades without any international appearance, the team of coach Velimir Petković re-started their continental campaigns in 2005, when his players reached the semi-final of the EHF Cup.

In the current season Göppingen hope for another qualification for the 2013/14 EHF Cup season – but first of all they hope to proceed to the next stage of this competition after reaching the Group Phase by eliminating Belarusian team Brest in Round 3.

“As two-time defending champions of the old EHF Cup, we are now looking forward to taking part in the new group phase of the competition,” media manager of the club Alexander Kolb mentions. “This will be a new experience and challenge for our team. Our club and our fans are excited. We have strong opponents, but we hope to reach the quarter-finals.”

Team captain and German international Michael Haaß shares those hopes: “In the third round we won twice against the Belarusian team of Brest, and now the draw gave us the matches against La Rioja, Eskilstuna and Koper. These will be interesting matches, but we want to go through the group to the quarter-finals.”

Because of an injury of goalkeeper Bastian Rutschmann, the club transferred its former goalkeeper Enid Tahirović back from Hamburg to Göppingen in mid-December, but the Bosnian veteran retired soon after.

Michael Haaß:

Some years later he arrived in Germany and coached Scharnhäusen, Wernau, Rintheim and Oßweil, before joining his first Bundesliga club in Wetzlar, where he was coach from 1998 until 2004. Then Petković started his mission in Göppingen, forming the team which became EHF Cup winner twice in 2011 and 2012.

Group Phase Preview:

After a long wait, Eskilstuna Guif returned to the European club competition scene in the 2009/10 season, reaching the fourth round of the Cup Winners' Cup. One year later they made it to the EHF Challenge Cup, and Kristján Andrésson's young team significantly improved on the domestic and international level, reaching the Last 16 of the EHF Cup last season.

This season the Swedish club's goals were clearly marked, similar success in the new format of the EHF Cup, as well as a first Swedish championship. The second round saw Guif come out on top in an all-Swedish duel with Kristianstad. This was followed by a surprise win over Spanish club BM Aragon in Round 3 by the narrowest of margins, having scored one away goal more than their competitors.

Coach Andrésson is now aiming even higher and hopes to qualify for the quarter-finals in the EHF Cup.

"Though we have to face tough opponents we want to finish the Group Phase among the top two teams in our group. Each of our opponents has great teams and those encounters will be big challenges for us to beat them," he said.

"We gain experience and energy from every game, and have the opportunities to compete against some of the best European teams. My personal favourites to reach the final tournament of the EHF Cup are Rhein-Neckar Löwen, SC Magdeburg, KIF Kolding, and Guif Eskilstuna," Andrésson predicted.

Group Phase Preview:

They were one of the biggest surprises in last season's VELUX EHF Champions League. After becoming Slovenian champions for the first time, Cimos Koper marched through to the quarter-final and were close to beating Atlético Madrid BM.

The previous year Cimos won their first European Cup title as they beat S.L. Benfica in the final of the EHF Challenge Cup.

They were part of the wild card tournament in the 2012/13 VELUX EHF Champions League season, but missed out on qualification for the Group Phase after losing 23:28 to Saint-Raphaël Var Handball in the semi-final.

But thanks to victories against Volendam and Porto, the Slovenian club made it to the Group Phase of the EHF Cup, although top players like Bojan Skoko or Sebastjan Skube have left the club, thus weakening the squad.

For club manager Aleš Koršič, the newly formed EHF Cup is an ideal competition for the Adriatic team. "It is more competitive, attractive and on a higher level than in the previous years. We want to produce good matches, a fantastic atmosphere in Koper and results like in last seasons in European Cup competitions," said Koršič.

Team captain Uroš Rapotec hopes to get very far in the EHF Cup, but understands that it will not be simple in their tough group. "We compete in a very tough group with quality teams from top handball nations. We will give our best in every game and try to go as far as possible," said Rapotec.

Season Preview:
Four seasons ago, Naturhouse La Rioja entered the international club stage and made a brilliant debut.

In their first two seasons in the EHF Cup the Spaniards reached the semi-final, so it was no major surprise that the team from the famous wine region made it to the Group Phase of the newly formed EHF Cup after eliminating Serbian club RK Vojvodina in the third round.

In the first half of this season La Rioja were hit hard by a number of injuries, with former Spanish national team player Rubén Garabaya Arenas out for at least nine months and Ales Abrao Silva sidelined for four months.

Pedro Rodríguez Álvarez, Unai Arrieta Aizpurua, and Gurutz Aguinagalde Aquizu were also out of action for a long time, but the club hopes that they will be back in the team for the start of the Group Phase.

Group Phase Preview:

One league is not enough has been the motto of TATRAN Prešov for years. Slovakia's dominant club once also played in the Czech league, then the Hungarian league, and most recently since the start of this season in the multi-national SEHA league. Given their exploits in the last few years, the Prešov players are used to traveling more than their opposing teams in the EHF Cup.

In previous years, Prešov were a constant participant in the EHF Champions League, but the Slovak champion failed in the qualification tournaments this and last season. However, even with this new personnel, the goals remained the same; winning the Slovak double of league and cup, reach the final tournament of the SEHA league and last but not least qualifying for the quarter-final of the EHF Cup. "The draw put us in a very tough group, so it will be a great challenge to win all of our home matches and to do our best in away matches to qualify for the quarter-finals," new manager Branko Benko said.

Team captain Radoslav Antl shares the opinion about the unlucky start of the season, but is looking forward to what lies ahead. "It's been a little bit of bad luck that we couldn't make it to the Champions League, but at least it (EHF Cup) is still a celebration for Prešov and Slovak handball. We will push ourselves to win all matches. Also we expect a great attendance of our fans in our home games, so we will do everything to satisfy the spectators."

After several years of refurbishment, the newly re-constructed Tatran Prešov Handball Arena is the new home for team and fans, and the new mascot, a horse, is going to entertain and support fans and team.

Group Phase Preview:

After the independence from Russia, Zaporozhye became a handball stronghold in the Ukraine, with two top clubs qualifying constantly for European Cup competitions; ZTR for men's teams and Motor for women's teams. Motor now can count on help from Russia, as not only coach Nikolay Chigarev has a huge experience at the side of legendary Vladimir Maximov at Chekhovskie Medvedi and the Russian national team, but also Alexej Kamanin is one of the most experienced Russian players.

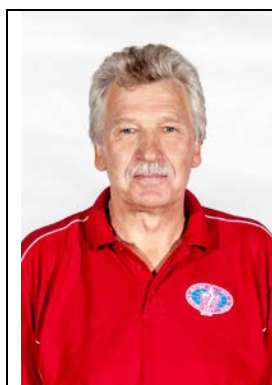

Group Phase Preview:

Rhein Neckar Löwen burst on to the EHF European Cup scene seven years ago. Founded from two clubs in the Mannheim area, Kronau and Östringen, in 2002, "the lions" rose directly to the top of the German Bundesliga. After reaching the final of the EHF Cup in 2008, they qualified for the VELUX EHF Champions League for the first time in the 2008/09 season, reaching the semi-final, and again two years later.

Last season, they closely missed out on the final of the EHF Cup after being eliminated by the eventual champions Frisch Auf Göppingen, losing 65:62 on aggregate after winning the first leg at home. Before the start of the current season, Löwen had to undergo big changes. Some key players left, some new, young and talented players arrived in coach Guðmundur Guðmundsson's squad. After only one defeat, against defending German and VELUX EHF Champions League champions THW Kiel, Rhein Neckar Löwen are currently top of the Bundesliga.

New players like Danish goalkeeper Niklas Landin (All Star Team member and silver medallist at the World Championship), Icelandic Alexander Petersson, Swedish international Kim Ekdahl du Rietz and the Spanish Guardiola brothers (including new world champion Gedeon) fit perfectly in the team. "We want to play attractive and passionate handball," is the motto of Rhein Neckar Löwen, who are supposed to be among the favourites to reach the Finals.

However, they have to cope with a severe injury to their most important player, German international and team captain Uwe Gensheimer, who is out until the end of the season after he tore his Achilles in the successful Round 3 match against Greek champions Argous Diomidis.

Group Phase Preview:

Not many clubs in the EHF Cup competition can boast a European Cup history like KIF Kolding's, but despite this tradition, a lot has changed in Kolding. After the bankruptcy of AG København, a number of former AGK players transferred to KIF to form a new nationwide top club for Denmark, with some of the clubs home games being played in the Danish capital. Among the new players is Kim Andersson, the world class left back from Sweden. With a strengthened squad and depth in many positions, hopes are high at the most successful Danish club in EHF European Cup competitions. KIF are hoping to add another Danish title to their tally this season and are aiming for the EHF Cup Finals in Nantes. Kolding had to start their campaign in Round 1, on their way to the Group Phase they only lost one of six matches, away to Russian side Permskie Medvedi, but the Danes comfortably won in the return leg.

One of the most experienced players in the KIF squad is goalkeeper Kasper Hvidt, the former Danish national team number one. Hvidt is enthusiastic about the new Kolding-Copenhagen project, but knows that building a team to compete at an international level is not simple. "With this new Kolding-Copenhagen project it is important that we show the world that we can compete on the highest level. Therefore our performance in the EHF Cup is very important and is a big focus for us.

"Of course everybody knows that is very difficult to build a new team in a very short time, but I think we can show the handball world the new big team in Europe," Hvidt said.

Group Phase Preview:

Team Tvis Holstebro is one of the rare clubs in the current EHF European Cup season that still has both male and female teams still in the competition, with both playing in the EHF Cup. The women were finalists in 2011, and the men are in their third international campaign.

Klavs Bruun Jørgensen, a former top star of the Danish national team who took over the team before this season as successor of Claus Uhrenholt, and his team had a high hurdle to clear in the third qualification round, but managed it unexpectedly easily.

Thanks to the 35:19 first leg victory against French powerhouse Saint-Raphael Var Handball, they made it to the Group Phase of the EHF Cup, the biggest international success history of Holstebro's men's team.

The Danish team are considered one of the main contenders to reach the Finals in Nantes, but the first goal of club director Jacob Jørgensen and team captain Mads Christiansen is to proceed to the quarter-finals. Holstebro will face one of their last season's players, Serbian international Petar Nenadić, in their duels with Wisła Płock.

"First of all I look forward to playing six additional European Cup matches. We have a young and - in an international context - inexperienced team, so the extra experience we can get through those matches will definitely help both our team and the club in our efforts to become more successful and perhaps to qualify one day for the Champions League," Klavs Bruun Jørgensen said.

"The group is exciting for us. It will be a great experience for us to compete with teams from Slovenia and Norway, which we hope to beat, and the Polish runners-up, Płock. With a little luck and our skills, we hope to advance from the group," he added.

Group Phase Preview:

Last season Orlen Wisła Płock made it to the Last 16 of the VELUX EHF Champions League after having become Polish champions. This season they failed to qualify in the wildcard tournament for the flagship club competition and had to settle for the EHF Cup.

They entered the competition in the third round and had an easy passage to the Group Phase of the newly structured EHF Cup after comfortably beating Russian side Sungul Snezhinsk. Danish-born coach Lars Walther has a high quality squad to his disposal and the team are among the favourites to reach the Finals in Nantes. The mission statement of club president Andrzej Miszczyński before the start of the Group Phase could not be clearer. "Our main goal is to win the group and then advance to the Finals of the EHF Cup," he said.

The Polish runners-up, who already beat VELUX EHF Champions League participants Vive Targi Kielce at domestic level this season, are also aiming high in their league, as they fight to take the crown this season. With their sight set on winning the league and to go all the way in the EHF Cup, the squad was improved by top players like Petar Nenadić, Valentin Ghionea, Ivan Nikčević, and Ferenc Ilyés before the start of the season. However, Ilyés and Piotr Chrapkowski are currently out with injuries.

"Our goal is to win the group, that's our main goal. We have to take our opponents seriously to do that. Team TVIS is in my opinion our hardest rival in the group. It means a lot for us to participate in Europe, so we can continue our development of our club and team in Europe. We want to be recognised as a European top team," Lars Walther said.

Group Phase Preview:

Slovenian handball is on the rise, as shown by the national team reaching its first semi-final at the 2013 World Championship in Spain.

At club level, Slovenia is among the top nations with regard to participants in the top EHF European Cup competitions. RK Celje and Gorenje Velenje stand strong in the VELUX EHF Champions League, Cimos Koper have made it to the Group Phase of the newly structured EHF Cup and so have RK Maribor Branik. Despite competing in Slovenia's top division for just five years, Maribor compete in an EHF European Cup competition for the third time, after reaching the quarter-finals in both the EHF Challenge Cup and the EHF Cup Winners' Cup in previous seasons.

En route to the Group Phase RK Branik Maribor had to play all three rounds. The Slovenians beat Dudelange, Kopavogur, and finally the Croatian team RK Siscia in Round 3.

Marko Šibila's squad are aiming high despite their strong and largely more experienced opponents. "It will be a big experience for us to compete with clubs like Orlen Wisła Płock. We are convinced, that there will be a good atmosphere in our hall, and with the support of our fans we can beat everyone," manager Andrej Bauman says. Team captain Simon Razgor says that the participation in the Group Phase of the EHF Cup is "a new milestone" in the history of handball in Maribor.

During the season Maribor became the short-term club of Renato Vugrinec, who arrived from Germany, but then transferred to Macedonian VELUX EHF Champions League participant Metalurg Skopje. The one long term injury in the squad is Blaž Kleč, the line player scored three goals in the competition before being sidelined.

Group Phase Preview:

After winning the Turkish league and cup double four times in a row since 2009, Beşiktaş have reached the Group Phase of the EHF Cup and aim to go even further.

In the EHF Cup third round, the Turkish champions caused a huge upset in the second leg. After losing the first leg against Norwegian champions Haslum HK 20:31, the chances of progressing appeared to be slim to none, but on their home court coach Mufit Arin and his team played one of their best international matches ever, winning 37:25 and securing a place in the Group Phase.

Arin is already a legend at Beşiktaş, with 18 domestic titles won under his leadership since 2004. But despite this loss, the squad is perfectly rehearsed as the majority have played together for the last eight years, and hopes for more international upsets are high in Istanbul, in particular at home where the club is especially strong, as manager Berk Karahan mentions:

“We haven't lost any game in Istanbul in the last five years of European Cup competitions. Now we want to win all home games in the Group Phase of the EHF Cup. It is not an advantage to be in the same group with Nantes, as they will do their best to qualify for the Final Tournament at home.

“Our club has won 18 domestic trophies in the last eight years and we long for European success. I am sure the spectators will be our eighth player in every home match.”

Team captain Ibrahim Demir counts on the team spirit and their experience to make the dream of victory come true: “We have played together for years. This is going to be a great advantage for us. We will try to do our best and I really trust my teammates, as they are good players.”

Group Phase Preview:

CS Știința Municipal Dedeman Bacău are a new face in the EHF Cup. After three appearances in the EHF Challenge Cup, including the semi-final in 2011, the Romanians qualified for the next level of competition for the first time this season. And after victories against Ystad from Sweden and Tel Aviv from Israel in Rounds 2 and 3, they have made it to the newly formed Group Phase at the first time of asking.

Coach Eliodor Voica, who is also the coach of the men's national team, led Bacău to the runners-up spot in the Romanian league, behind perennial champions Constanta last season.

Bacău can count on a well-rehearsed squad, without any star players, but with a huge amount of team spirit.

The road to the Group Phase:

Group Phase Preview:

None of the 16 participants in the Group Phase of the newly formed EHF Cup have been more successful in EHF European Cup competitions than German side SC Magdeburg.

They are the only former winner of the EHF Champions League among the 16 teams in the Group Phase; additionally they won the EHF Cup three times.

Last season Magdeburg missed out on the EHF Cup final, after a one goal aggregate loss to Dunkerque HB Grand Littoral in the semi-final.

This season's goals include qualification for the EHF Cup again, which requires a fifth or sixth place finish in the German Bundesliga, and reaching the EHF Cup Finals in Nantes.

Manager Steffen Stiebler, 2002 EHF Champions League winner as a player, is happy about the draw and the prospect of their away matches.

"We like to face Istanbul, Bacau, and Nantes. It is a challenge for us to play in those countries."

Team captain and Polish international, Bartosz Jurecki, has his eyes set on a place in Nantes.

"We hope that we can reach the quarter-finals, but this is only the next step towards our main goal, to reach the Finals in Nantes."

However, reaching the Group Phase itself was a real high hurdle to clear for Magdeburg, as their third round tie against Vardar Skopje of FYR Macedonia was decided by a single goal over two legs.

SCM won 30:27 at home, but had to fight to hold on to their lead in the second leg in the Macedonian capital as they lost 26:28.

The road to the Group Phase:

Round 3: 29:21, 22:28 against S.L. Benfica

Group Phase Preview:

"Spanish eyes" is not only a famous song, but could also be a new line to describe the character of HBC Nantes: Three newly crowned world champions are in the squad of the French team, playing in only their second season in Europe, but are already among the favourites in the newly restructured EHF Cup.

After Valero Rivera junior, son of the Spanish national team coach Valero Rivera, was the first Spaniard to come, Nantes signed Jorge Maqueda and Alberto Entrerrios before the start of this season. Entrerrios lifted the World Championship trophy in Barcelona as team captain.

The major success of this trio will be a boost for HBC Nantes' upcoming matches of, as is the fact that the French club is the organiser of the first EHF Cup Finals.

If Nantes finish first in their group or is among the three best second ranked teams, they directly qualify for the Finals in May, without having to play the quarter-finals.

Nantes did not have it all their own way either, after a clear 29:21 win in the first leg of Round 3, they were made to fight for their lead, losing 22:28 at Portuguese side Benfica Lisboa.

Gaël Pelletier, President of HBC Nantes, said that the qualification for the Group Phase of the EHF Cup was "a very important objective." He added: "We need international recognition as we are a young club in the elite of handball in France."

"I know that the notoriety of a club comes through his results in European Cup competitions. Our objective is to finish first or second in our group."

Last season, Rivera was voted best left wing and most valuable player in the French league and was the league's top scorer. Currently the Spaniard ranks second in the league's top scorer list.



Rock Feliho:

Born on 18 August 1982

The French left back, who became team captain when he arrived in Nantes 2010, was voted "best defender" in the previous season of the French league. Feliho started his professional career in 2000, when joining Sélestat Alsace Handball.

Four years later he transferred for two seasons to HBC Villefranche Handball, before he crossed the German border to play for TSG Münster and later first league team HBW Balingen-Weilstetten, where he was contracted for four seasons, before he returned home to join Nantes in 2010.

Thierry Anti:

Born on 19 February 1959

Thierry Anti is the coach of HBC Nantes for the fourth consecutive season after he had been the head coach of Paris Handball for six years from 2004 to 2009. Before that he was coach in his home club US Creteil after he had finished his player career there.

Anti led Creteil to four French Cup trophies and added another trophy with Paris to his tally, after winning three league titles as a player with Creteil (division 1) and Pontault-Combault (division 2).
