Splendid venues for the EURO

The EHF EURO Qualification will be the first chapter of a EURO Event that promises spectacle never seen in women's handball before. At the end of 2010, the 14 best teams of the European continent will be hosted by two traditional top nations in an exclusive environment.

The EHF EURO 2010 will take place from 7th to 19th of December 2010. The preliminary rounds will be played in two Norwegian and two Danish cities: Larvik, Lillehammer, Aalborg and a fourth venue to be published soon.

Two giant arenas will be the venues of the Main Round. The Norwegian skiing resort of Lillehammer has a great reputation for staging the biggest sporting event, the 1994 Winter Olympic Games, but also for hosting the final of the Men's EHF EURO 2008. Please note, the venue was considered lucky for the Danes who were lifted the EURO plate there in January 2008.

The other Main Round venue will be Herning, Denmark. At the time of the above mentioned Danish victory, the MCH Multiarena did not even exist. The state-of-the-art giant arena of Herning will be completed next summer/autumn and the first big international sports event will be the EHF EURO 2010 here.

The MCH Multiarena, with its 28,000 square metres, will offer everything visitors could dream of: multi-flexible covered hall, stadium, business park, drive-in cinema, adventure land and cable car.

Herning will be the venue of the finals & placement matches on 18-19th December and 14,000 fans can fill the stands.

If you want to be there, you are welcome to return to the official EHF EURO website from August 2010 when the tickets will go on sale.
